#### **Welcome All**

The Executive Committee (EC) of the National Association of Councillors, Northern Ireland Region (NAC), congratulate those of you that have been re-elected for the new term of office, and extend a warm welcome to all newly elected members.

## Meetings Update

The EC have had meetings on the 5 June and the 3 July 2023.

Due the elections, there are now a reduced number of members but all vacancies will be filled at the NAC AGM in October. Cllr Billy Webb is now interim Treasurer following the retirement of the former Treasurer, Angus Carson.

The first NAC NI Members' Meeting of this new term took place in Newry Conference Centre on Wednesday 19 July 2023. This meeting had to held on an in-person basis due to a late change of venue. The Chair of Newry, Mourne & Down District Council, Cllr Valerie Harte provided a warm welcome to the NAC delegates in attendance, she explained that they currently don't have a chamber available for meetings due to work being carried out.



The next meeting will be hosted by Derry City & Strabane District Council and will take place in the *Guildhall in Londonderry* on *Wednesday 20 September 2023*, and we hope that this can be carried out in hybrid format using the council facilities.

#### **NAC NI Constitution**

Changes have been made to the current Constitution to update it and the draft revised Constitution which was drawn up by the EC was approved by members on 15 March was circulated to all councils on 22 March. Two councils have written to the NAC and the points raised are being addressed by the EC with a view to having the updated Constitution approved and implemented at the NAC AGM in October 2023.
